#### Pate Swap Meet - Planning and Preview

The annual Pate meeting was held at Casa Del Castillo restaurant in Waco with all member clubs represented. Lunch was provided but, since I'm a sprout, I just stop at Taqueria El Mexicano in Belton and picked up some tacos. It's hard for me to pass through Belton without picking up some of their miga and bean and cheese tacos.

This year three clubs will be sharing parts hauling and vendor escort duties. Austin Area Car Club (AACC) will be helping with parts hauling along with us and TexArk Car Club and we will assist with vendor escort. This should work out well since vendor escorts are busier when we are not and visa versa. We should also benefit with some more help on Tuesday when we unload the storage containers and put the carts together. I'm also thinking about getting a stencil which says "REQUEST PARTS HAULING AT INFORMATION BOOTHS" to print this message on the side boards of the trailers. Let me know your opinion of this.

I presented a rough draft of guidelines for parts hauling and vendor escort and hope to refine them with feedback from other directors and club members.

It looks like we will have the special engine hoist and it should have a dedicated cart and driver. They are contemplating adding another gate at the back of the grassy area but it's uncertain if we have enough help to operate it. That entrance was a problem last year and will be redesigned to prevent vehicle entry this year.

Color coded vendor passes are in. Colors will relate to various swap meet zones with colored flags at entrances and should help to get vendors to enter into the proper zone initially. 7,806 spaces have been sold so far. The handicap scooter vendor has requested 3 golf carts to transport handicap persons in addition to taking parts out to fix broken carts and tow broken carts back to their tent. The contract with the speedway is valid through 2027.

There will be a tile party on March 18 10am (rain date March 23) to assist in placing space ID tiles on the spaces through out the swap meet.

I had a brief chat with director Michael Cawley who is heavily involved in scouting to see if scouts would be interested in helping to recycle at the swap meet. Not sure if this will go anywhere but it's a shame for an event of this size not to have a recycling effort.

We do not anticipate any problems with the porta potties this year. A stretch of good weather would go a long way toward avoiding any issues.


#### Air Conditioning in the Winter

Snowmageddon took out the air conditioning on the big truck in February 2021. It was charged up during that summer to keep it bearable. There were a lot of mini-tours and a July trailer glamping trip in 2022 where having air conditioning would have really taken the edge off. It was near impossible, however, to get a reservation at the shop and my Toyota mechanic wouldn't touch it and I was afraid of my BMW mechanic's fees. I searched for a specialized mechanic for Vintage Air/Classic Air and located Martin's Rod and Custom in Lampasas, TX – which also fulfills my desire to go further north instead of back into Austin.

Part of their "new customer" service is to do a full inspection on the vehicle. It's the vehicle equivalent of asking "does this make me look fat?" Don't ask the question if you don't want to hear the answer! stoplight (green, yellow, red, N/A) checksheet, they go over the entire vehicle: panel alignments, latches and doors, lighting, gauges, chassis, wiring, suspension, brakes, fuel, transmission – you get the point. Then they provide an estimate on all of that. After you pick yourself off of the floor, you can then prioritize what you can do yourself, what they should do, or what you can get by with until later. Although shocking, it is a really great service document and would be indispensable to have them do before buying a classic car.



Pre-Maintenance Inspection – 13 pages long

After vacuum and pressure testing the air conditioning freon system and finding no leaks and recharging it once again, I reminded them of SnowVID and told them to leave it outside during the 2023 Arborgeddon storm — our recent ice event that took out all of the tree limbs — and they found the leak.

→ It's hard to whine about not having air conditioning when my Dad has lived in Las Vegas for the last 60+ years and drove his 1963 Ford F-100 stepside truck to work every day without it. I mean, it's easy to whine . . . just who is going to listen?

The other item Martin's identified that I did not feel comfortable doing myself at home was that the carrier bearing was no longer connected to the driveshaft. Additionally, once they got it apart, it was discovered that the U-Joints also needed replacement. At least the oil condition and levels were good. That's because one has to continually check and top it off. Someone once told me that if

an old car is not leaking, then it's empty and needs to be refilled. Mine is leaking at the front main seal – which then covers everything else in oil and gunk. The other leaks I can manage at home.

Upon first dropping off the truck, the service advisor offered that I should take a tour of the facility – that has a line of cool cars out front and a lot of space for many projects. However, my ride had an appointment she needed to get to. I did reserve that our club would want to stop in for a complete tour the next time we find ourselves back north in Lampasas.


What first sounds like three guys sitting around the shop trying to outdo each other on car stories, one must consider the sources. The contributors are Tony Matthews who worked as a freelance illustrator from 1976 to 2003, Jim McCraw a 45-year writer for automotive magazines, and Rick Voegelin, a PhD dropout who quit school to work on a drag racing magazine. The "Mac" at Motor City Garage is Bill McGuire, vice-president and editor-in-chief who also wore many hats in the automotive magazine industry.

The article is titled "Cool Breeze from Kenosha: the 1964 Rambler Typhoon" with the claim "To showcase its all-new 232 cubic-inch inline six engine, in 1964 American Motors introduced a limited-production Rambler Classic and called it the Typhoon.

The old inline 6 (still an L-head) had been in production since the 1940s and was replaced by the new state-of-the-art Torque Command Six. It had an initial displacement of 232 cubic inches and 145 horsepower.

The new inline six was a \$59.95 option for the 1964 Classic or Ambassador. Although only 2,520 Typhoons were produced, the article claims that a remarkable number still seems to survive!

#### PISTONS ON THE SQUARE - 2/18/2023

It was the last freeze for the season and, although the air was still, the sun could never quite peek through the clouds and warm it up. Pistons-on-the-Square had more people when it was misting rain but not as cold. Many lamented their thermostat must be low when the heaters never really warmed up but this may also because each one making this statement had holes in the firewall or their vent (1963 Corvette) was stuck open. This was February 18, 2023.

DJ mentioned the import restrictions lifted on small Japanese cars which is evident by the obscure small gull wing sports cars present. Mentioned last month (but the doors were shut because of rain) is the Autozam AZ-1 looking minute next to a VW Bug. Only 4,400 Autozam AZ-1s were made.

The Toyota Sera debuted in 1988 as the Toyota AXV-II concept car and is noted for its mostly glass roof canopy and its butterfly doors, which tilt up and forward when open.

Total of 15,941 were built between February 1990 and December 1995. Being it was only available in for the Japanese market, all Toyota Sera models are right-hand drive.
